During the stay, all residents receive breakfast and dinner, access to laundry facilities, case management services and linkages to resources. The primary goal of the Interim Housing program is to assist residents with obtaining income and permanent housing. All residents have access to the PATH Depot which has more than 20 service provider's onsite offering services such as mental health, medical, budgeting, cooking, relaxation groups, and much more.

Eligibility

Eligibility Criteria: 1. Single adults over the age of 18 (PATH Interim Housing is unavailable to individuals & couples with children) 2. Must meet HUD's definition of homelessness. PATH prioritizes chronic homelessness and living in places not meant for human habitation. 3. Must be able to perform Activities of Daily Living (ADL); using the restroom, getting ready, and feeding themselves without assistance 4. Annual income must not exceed 30% Area Median Income 5. Cannot be a registered sex offender

Participants must be between the ages of 18-24, meet the HUD homeless definition, have been assessed by the VI-SPDAT and determined to be best served through a rapid re-housing model. Household income less than 80% of AMI, a household can only be eligible for this program 2 times in 3 years and total rental assistance should not exceed 24 months. Households must also agree to find housing within the city limits of San Diego. Housing assistance can only be provided in a zip code starting with 921.
